Cataloging fees will be deducted from consignment payout or invoiced in the event the horse is removed from the sale. The cataloging fee is \$50.00 + HST = \$57.50

NOTE: SALE COMMISSION 6%.

Registration certificate and/or Standardbred Canada transfer of ownership form signed by the owner(s) to follow by September 2nd, 2024.

Proof of liability insurance coverage for consignors must accompany the entry form. Accepted forms of liability coverage are a letter on company letterhead from your insurance provider or SC horse liability insurance coverage.

1. There will be a minimum bid of \$1,000.00 enforced. Any entry not receiving the minimum bid in 30 seconds will be removed from the ring. The minimum fee of \$200.00 + HST (\$30.00) = \$230.00 will apply.
2. If more entries are received by the entry deadline than can be accommodated at Crapaud Agri Plex, the Atlantic Classic Sale Committee reserves the right to provide preference for entry to PEI breeders and/or previous or recent consignors.
3. Consignors will be assigned stalls at the Atlantic Classic Sale's discretion.
4. The Atlantic Classic Sale, within its sole discretion, may make changes to the format of the Atlantic Classic Sale and the consignor agrees to be bound by such changes.
5. A RESERVE BID PROCESS will be in effect. If consignors wish to enter a reserved bid, they must complete a Reserve Bid Form. Reserve bids will be accepted until 9 a.m. on sale day by the Sale Manager. This information will be passed to the auctioneer by the Sale Manager. Should a change of mind take place, the Consignor and the Sale Manager must sign an amendment or cancellation form no later than 10 a.m. on sale day. Under no circumstances, shall the consignor attempt to make changes directly through the auctioneer. Should the reserve bid not be achieved, the Consignor will be charged SIX PERCENT (6%) OF THE RESERVE BID + HST, MINIMUM OF \$200.00 + HST.
6. The Atlantic Classic Sale retains the HST on the sale of yearlings and remits the HST on behalf of the consignor. The Consignor's settlement will be the purchase price of the yearling, less commission, HST on commission, cataloging fee(s), and HST on cataloging fee(s). ACS HST# 868560525RT0001



CONSIGNOR'S CONTRACT

By entering a yearling in the Atlantic Classic Sale and/or by the consignor or agent signing this entry form, the consignor does hereby agree to the following terms and conditions:

- a. **All yearlings entered, are required to be at the place of sale prior to 1:00 p.m. on October 10th, 2024 (any exceptions must be approved by the Sale Manager in advance) and delivered free of charge to the Atlantic Classic Sale. Reserve bids will be accepted until 9 am on sale day.**
- b. **A yearling viewing will be held October 10th from 3-7 p.m. at the sale grounds.**
- c. **The sale will commence at 11:30 a.m. on October 11th, 2024. All yearlings consigned to the sale must have their assigned hip numbers on and be ready for presentation to interested buyers by no later than 9 a.m. on sale day.**
- d. No yearling shall be withdrawn from the sale after **MAY 31st, 2024**, except in the case of injury or sickness subject to the approval of the sales organization and the provision of **A VETERINARY CERTIFICATE SIGNED BY THE ATTENDING VETERINARIAN**. Consignors who are veterinarians cannot sign their own veterinary certificate. In the case of unauthorized withdrawal, the consignor shall pay the sales organization THE OUT FEE of \$2000.00 + CATALOGING FEE + HST = \$2,357.50.
- e. The yearlings consigned to the Atlantic Classic Sale are entirely at the risk of the consignor until sold. The Atlantic Classic Sale organization acts simply as agent. The consignor guarantees the title of the yearling to the buyer and thereby represents that there are no claims against, no liens upon, nor ownership, in whole or in part, of any yearling entered in the sale by the consignor that can in any way interfere with its rightful sale and delivery. The consignor also warrants that all unsoundness or faults known to the consignor shall be stated and that no yearling suffering from any contagious disease or that is unsafe or vicious will be consigned.
- f. The consignor agrees to be present in person, or to have a duly appointed representative present, to make true representation of each yearling and further agrees to defend any suit of law brought by the purchaser by reason of, or on account of, the sale of such yearling. In case of dispute with respect to the representations made, including stakes' engagements, the consignor shall be fully liable for the costs of any legal action and related costs.

- g. The Atlantic Classic Sale organization is authorized to decline any bid by apparently intoxicated or disorderly parties or by those who have defaulted on previous purchases, or by persons who, in their judgment, are not responsible parties. Should any disputes arise between or among two or more bidders, the auctioneer shall forthwith adjudicate the dispute and his decision shall be absolute, binding, and final on all parties. In the case where a buyer fails to pay for and accept a yearling struck down to him/her, the Atlantic Classic Sale organization is authorized to accept the same amount from another person, or to accept the next highest bid, or they may, if in their judgment to be in the best interest of all concerned, put the yearling up for sale the second time.
- h. A commission of SIX percent (6% + HST) on the highest bid (or reserve bid) will be charged to the consignor with a minimum of \$200.00 + HST. Where a yearling is bid in by the consignor the commission must be paid prior to removing the bid in yearling from the sales' venue. In the event this is not done the commission charged for such bid ins may be doubled and the registration papers held until such time as payment is received by the sales' organization. Any yearling passed through the ring without a bid will be subject to the minimum commission of \$200.00 + HST. If a horse is put up for sale a second time, the horse will be sold by the Atlantic Classic Sale at their discretion on the initial buyer's account, and the initial buyer will be liable for a 6% commission charge +HST (Minimum \$200 + HST) on the amount of the second sale, and any shortfall in price between the first and second sale, and any other liabilities specified by law.
- i. The Atlantic Classic Sale organization will settle with the consignor for yearlings sold at the sale after the full settlement of accounts and the presentation of all necessary documentation. All ownership papers will be held for a minimum of 30 days and only released with the approval of the Sale Manager.
- j. All yearlings presented for sale must show proof of proper identification and be accompanied by appropriate documentation including parentage verification, confirmation of registration with Standardbred Canada or the United States Trotting Association and other documentation as may be deemed necessary from time to time.
- k. In all events the Atlantic Classic Sale organization is acting as agent.
- l. The Atlantic Classic Sale organization or any partner, individual, or employee thereof, shall not be held legally liable for any action or suit at law, whatsoever, on the part of the consignor, the person, or persons for whom the sale is held, or any purchaser.
